Chevron and the Pan American Development Foundation Distribute Emergency Supplies in Jamaica

Kingston, Jamaica (September 10, 2008) – In the wake of Hurricane Gustav, which left 11 dead in Jamaica, Chevron Corporation provided immediate financial support for disaster relief materials to residents stranded after the storm.

The Pan American Development Foundation, working in tandem with the Organization of American States (OAS), distributed food, water, and other emergency supplies funded by Chevron to residents near Portland whose homes were destroyed or damaged.

These activities are part of PADF's Disaster Management Emergency Response Program (DMERP), designed to engage the private sector in relief efforts. Chevron was the founding member of the DMERP in 2007.

"PADF and Chevron are proud to be able to work together to meet the urgent needs of Jamaicans," says Amy Coughenour, Deputy Director of the Pan American Development Foundation.

Hurricane Gustav, which caused massive flooding and storm damage throughout the Caribbean, downed trees and tore roofs off houses in Jamaica, driving thousands of residents into temporary shelters. Chevron's donations were distributed among people who could not return to their homes.

Chevron and PADF are committed to relief and recovery efforts in Jamaica. PADF, Chevron, and the International Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA), wrapped up a project in Elim that restored the Sydney Pagon Agricultural High School and provided seeds and fertilizer to farmers whose crops were damaged by Hurricane Dean.

"Chevron is proud of the work we have done with PADF to help Jamaicans after the recent storms," said David Sterling, Chevron's retail district manager in Jamaica. "We feel that it is our responsibility to help those in need when a crisis situation arises. We encourage other companies to get involved and support relief efforts such as these."

Chevron and PADF are currently involved in relief efforts in Haiti, distributing emergency supplies.

Since the launch of the Disaster Management Emergency Response Program in 2007, Chevron and PADF provided disaster relief materials in Haiti, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Peru, and Nicaragua and supported agricultural recovery projects in Dominica. Chevron will continue to support relief and recovery efforts throughout the 2008 hurricane season.
